Dear Ms. Lopez:

I have been retained by St. Augustine to prepare a revised solicitation ordinance which includes panhandling and begging which would act to repeal and replace Section 18 – 8 of St. Augustine’s code entitled begging, panhandling and solicitation which was presented as amended ordinance number 10 – 35.

To that end I have forwarded you a revised ordinance which will be first read at the upcoming February 26, 2018 meeting which commences at 5:00 p.m. I have also forwarded you most recently a strikethrough and underlined copy as regards comparison to my first draft.

I have also begun assimilating evidence that I will present at that meeting and have forwarded you same divided into the following categories pursuant to your request: 1) written public comment testimony of residents, business owners and visitors; 2) photographs of conditions; 3) citation and arrest records; 4) an interactive and fluid map presentation which will be submitted on the monitor and by photographic reference at the meeting. The estimate of the photographic representation is 20 maps which will capture and portray the effect of the distance driven ordinance on solicitation within the city limits of St. Augustine.

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The following is my order of presentation: 1) I will introduce myself, once again, describe the scope of my retention, describe my efforts in that endeavor, describe the results of my review and research, and generally describe the ordinance that I will be presenting; 2) I will present the first three categories of the foregoing evidence category by category to the clerk for reference as exhibits one, two, and three; 3) I will elicit testimony from several witnesses. First, Police Chief Barry Fox will testify. Second, several of his officers will testify. Third, business leader and former Mayor Len Weeks will testify. Fourth, Todd Grant will testify and the interactive map will be projected on the monitor and he will further answer questions about it. At the conclusion of his testimony, I will enter into evidence through the clerk 20 maps, as composite exhibit 4, which will be the photographic representation of the interactive map about which Mr. Grant has been testifying.

To further establish the record, I am requesting that a local court reporter be present to take testimony down for my entire presentation.

I plan on introducing further evidence for the second reading of the ordinance which will occur on March 26, 2018. I also plan on eliciting further testimony at the second reading of the ordinance which will occur on March 26, 2018 including additional and more comprehensive testimony from law enforcement personnel and other first-hand witnesses of the effects of solicitation including but not limited to panhandling and begging in the city of St. Augustine.

Please let me know if you require further information from me. I am privileged to, once again, serve the city of St. Augustine as I did previously when I authored ordinances successfully regulating adult entertainment, street performers, and street vendors.

ORDINANCE NO. 2018-06

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF ST. AUGUSTINE, FLORIDA, REPEALING AND REPLACING SECTION 18-8 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF ST. AUGUSTINE; PROVIDING FOR FINDINGS AND INTENT; PROVIDING FOR DEFINITIONS; PROVIDING FOR PROHIBITED CONDUCT, PROXIMITY AND LOCATION RESTRICTIONS FOR SOLICITATION, PANHANDLING OR BEGGING; PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES; PROVIDING FOR INCLUSION IN THE CODE OF THE CITY OF ST. AUGUSTINE; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERANCE OF INVALID PROVISIONS; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, § 166.041, Florida Statutes, provides for procedures for the adoption of ordinances and resolutions by municipalities; and

WHEREAS, the City of St. Augustine recognizes that solicitation, including but not limited to panhandling and begging are activities that are protected by the First Amendment to the United States Constitution; and

WHEREAS, the City of St. Augustine can adopt and enforce regulations of behavior that implicate First Amendment activity when the regulations only affect the time, place, and manner of expression, are content-neutral, are narrowly tailored to serve a significant governmental interest, and leave open ample alternative channels of communication; and

WHEREAS, the City of St. Augustine has a significant interest in providing a safe and pleasant environment and in eliminating nuisance activity, *Smith v. City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida*, 177 F. 3d 954, 956 (11th Cir. 1999); and

WHEREAS, the City of St. Augustine has experienced a significant increase in the number of complaints made to the St. Augustine Police Department regarding panhandling and problematic panhandling behaviors; and,

WHEREAS, the City Commission finds that panhandlers and beggars, sometimes use profane language when requesting money from people; that panhandlers and beggars sometimes physically touch or threaten to touch the people they solicit for money; and that panhandlers and beggars sometimes block the path of people they solicit for money, or follow the people they solicit for money in an apparent effort to intimidate people into making a donation or as retribution for refusing to make a donation; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission finds that the foregoing activities constitute “aggressive panhandling or begging,” and that the increase in aggressive panhandling or begging throughout the City of St. Augustine has become extremely disturbing and disruptive to residents, visitors, and businesses, and has contributed to an enhanced sense of fear, intimidation, and disorder resulting in the loss of access to and enjoyment of public places throughout the City; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission finds that regulation of panhandling and begging, based on the time, place, or manner of the solicitation including but not limited to panhandling or begging, is a content neutral and narrowly tailored way to promote public safety, and protect residents and visitors in areas where they may be or perceive themselves to be vulnerable and/or unable to leave; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission finds that regulation of panhandling and begging, in public places where people feel particularly vulnerable and/or unable to leave

still provides ample alternative avenues of communication and are narrowly drawn to address the City's substantial interests; and

WHEREAS, the City of St. Augustine has a significant interest in preserving the safety of traffic flow and preventing traffic congestion wherever possible in the City of St. Augustine; and

WHEREAS, the City of St. Augustine has a significant interest in the safety of pedestrians and individuals traveling in vehicles throughout the City of St. Augustine; and

WHEREAS, the City of St. Augustine has a significant interest in promoting tourism, and aesthetics of historic downtown St. Augustine; and

WHEREAS, the City of St. Augustine has a significant interest in promoting the safety and convenience of its citizens on public streets. *Madsen v. Women's Health Center*, 512 U.S. 753, 768, 114 S. Ct. 2516, 129 L.Ed. 2d 593 (1994); and

WHEREAS, the City of St. Augustine has a significant interest in ensuring the public safety and order and in promoting the free flow of traffic on public streets and sidewalks; and

WHEREAS, the City of St. Augustine has a significant interest in the safety and convenience of citizens using public fora such as streets and sidewalks. *Heffron v. International Soc'y for Krishna Consciousness*, 452 U.S. 640, 650, 101 S. Ct. 2559, 69 L.Ed. 2d 298 (1981); and

WHEREAS, the City of St. Augustine has a significant interest in recognizing the safety and convenience on public roads. *Cox v. New Hampshire*, 312 U.S. 569, 574, 61 S. Ct. 762, 85 L.Ed. 1049 (1941); and

WHEREAS, the City of St. Augustine has a significant interest in controlling traffic and pedestrian congestion. *Ayres v. City of Chicago*, 125 F. 3d 1010, 1015 (7th Cir. 1997); and

WHEREAS, the City of St. Augustine has a significant interest in preventing crime, protecting the City's retail trade, maintaining property values, and generally protecting and preserving the quality of the City's neighborhoods, commercial districts and the quality of urban life. *Young v. American Mini Theaters*, 427 U.S. 50, 96 S. Ct. 440, 49 L.Ed. 2d 310 (1976); and

WHEREAS, the City of St. Augustine has a significant interest in appearance of the City and aesthetics. *Metromedia Inc. v. City of San Diego*, 453 U.S. 490, 101 S. Ct. 2882 (1981); and

WHEREAS, the City of St. Augustine has a significant interest in maintaining safe ingress and egress into and out of commercial establishments in order to, inter alia, control pedestrian congestion, facilitate pedestrian safety and order, and provide for access for emergency vehicles and personnel both fire and police to promote public health, safety, and welfare; and

WHEREAS, the City of St. Augustine has a compelling governmental interest in preserving and protecting the lives of its citizens which can be imperiled by,

inter alia, traffic and pedestrian congestion which among other things can delay deployment of life saving fire and police vehicles and personnel; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of St. Augustine has determined that the following regulations promote and protect the general health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the City of St. Augustine; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission for the City of St. Augustine finds that it is in the best interest of public health, safety, and general welfare that the following amendments be adopted consistent with the requirements of Section 166.021(4), Florida Statutes;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION FOR THE CITY OF ST. AUGUSTINE, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Repeal and Replacement of Chapter 18, Article I, Section 18-8.
Chapter 18, Article I, Section 18-8 of the Code of the City of St. Augustine is hereby repealed and replaced as follows (deletions are identified using a strike-through format; additions are underlined):

~~Sec. 18-8. — Begging, panhandling and solicitation.~~

~~(a) — Definitions.~~

~~(1) — After dark means from one half hour after sunset until one half hour before sunrise. The times of sunset and sunrise will be established by the times listed in any local publication of general distribution.~~

~~(2) — Aggressive manner shall mean:~~

- a. — ~~Approaching or speaking to a particular person or persons, or following a person before, during or after panhandling, soliciting or begging, if that conduct is intended or likely to cause a reasonable person to:~~
 - 1. — ~~Fear bodily harm to oneself or to another, damage to or loss of property; or~~
 - 2. — ~~Otherwise be threatened or intimidated into giving money or other thing of value; or~~
- b. — ~~Intentionally touching or causing physical contact with another person or a vehicle operated by another person, without that person's consent, in the course of panhandling, soliciting or begging; or~~
- c. — ~~In the course of panhandling, soliciting or begging, intentionally blocking or interfering with the safe or free passage of any pedestrian or vehicle by any means, including unreasonably causing any pedestrian or vehicle operator to take evasive action to avoid physical contact; or~~
- d. — ~~Forcing oneself upon the company of another by continuing to solicit the individual addressed after the person to whom the panhandling, soliciting or begging is directed has made a negative response, either orally, by physical sign, by attempting to leave the presence of the person soliciting or by other negative indication.~~

(3) — ~~Panhandle, solicit or beg shall mean the employment of the spoken, written or printed word or other acts as are conducted in the furtherance of the purpose of immediately collecting money or any other item of value for the use of one's self or others. As used in this section, the word, "solicit," and its forms, includes begging and panhandling.~~

(4) — ~~Prohibited public area means those areas within historic preservation districts HP-2 and HP-3, and includes the sidewalks exterior thereto, all as more fully described below, and depicted in the map entitled "Ordinance 2006-40 No Panhandling Area" made a part hereof by reference and a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the City of St. Augustine:~~

- a. — ~~Northern boundary. Commence at a point on the northernmost sidewalk adjacent to Castillo Drive~~

located 255 feet west of the center line of South Castillo Drive; thence easterly along the northernmost sidewalk adjacent to Castillo Drive to the easternmost sidewalk adjacent to South Castillo Drive; thence southerly along the easternmost sidewalk adjacent to South Castillo Drive to the intersection of the projection of a line running along the northern boundary of the Castillo de San Marcos National Monument Reservation; thence easterly along this projection line to Matanzas Bay.

b. ~~Eastern boundary.~~ Matanzas River or Bay.

c. ~~Southern boundary.~~ Commencing at the southernmost sidewalk adjacent to King Street at the intersection with Cordova Street, thence easterly along the southernmost sidewalk adjacent to King Street along this projection line to Matanzas Bay.

d. ~~Western boundary.~~ Commencing at the westernmost sidewalk adjacent to Cordova Street at the intersection with King Street, thence northerly along the westernmost sidewalk adjacent to Cordova Street (as referenced in public records prior to the year 2000) to a point on the northernmost sidewalk adjacent to Castillo Drive located two hundred fifty five (255) feet west of the center line of South Castillo Drive.

(b) ~~Prohibition.~~ It shall be unlawful for any person within the city to:

(1) ~~Panhandle, solicit or beg in an aggressive manner on any sidewalk, highway, street, roadway, right-of-way, parking lot, park, or other public or semi-public area or in any building lobby, entranceway, plaza or common area;~~

(2) ~~Approach an operator or other occupant of a motor vehicle for the purpose of panhandling, soliciting or begging, or offering to perform a service in connection with such vehicle, or otherwise soliciting the sale of goods or services, if such panhandling, soliciting or begging is done in an aggressive manner;~~

(3) ~~Panhandle, solicit or beg in an aggressive manner on private property if the owner, tenant or lawful occupant has asked the person not to solicit on the property, or has posted a sign~~

clearly indicating that solicitations are not welcome on the property;

- ~~(4) — Panhandle, solicit or beg on any sidewalk, highway, street, roadway, right of way, parking lot, park, or other public or semi-public area or in any building lobby, entranceway, plaza or common area in the prohibited public area. The city manager shall post signs in such area advising the public of this prohibition;~~
- ~~(5) — Panhandle, solicit or beg within twenty (20) feet of the entrance to any financial institution or any automatic teller machine;~~
- ~~(6) — Panhandle, solicit or beg within twenty (20) feet of any parking meters or parking pay stations;~~
- ~~(7) — Panhandle, solicit or beg at any lawfully permitted outdoor dining area or lawfully permitted outdoor merchandise area, provided such areas are in active use at the time;~~
- ~~(8) — Panhandle, solicit or beg at any transit stop or taxi stand or in a public transit vehicle;~~
- ~~(9) — Panhandle, solicit or beg while the person or persons being solicited is standing in line waiting to be admitted to a commercial establishment;~~
- ~~(10) — Panhandle, solicit or beg by touching the person or persons being solicited without that person's consent;~~
- ~~(11) — Panhandle, solicit or beg by blocking the path of the person or persons being solicited or blocking the entrance or exit to any building or vehicle;~~
- ~~(12) — Panhandle, solicit or beg with the use of profane or abusive language during the solicitation or following an unsuccessful solicitation;~~
- ~~(13) — Panhandle, solicit or beg by or with the use of any gesture or act intended to cause a reasonable person to be fearful of the solicitor or feel compelled to accede to the solicitation;~~
- ~~(14) — Panhandle, solicit or beg while under the influence of alcohol or after having illegally used any controlled substance, as defined in the Chapter 893 of the Florida Criminal Statutes; or~~
- ~~(15) — Panhandle, solicit or beg after dark.~~

- ~~(c) — *Exception.* This law is not intended to limit any person from exercising his or her constitutional rights or engaging in any other constitutionally protected activity unless their conduct also violates the specific terms of this section. Rather, it is the intent of this section to protect citizens from the fear and intimidation accompanying panhandling, soliciting or begging in an aggressive manner, as prohibited herein, and to promote the health, safety and welfare of the citizens and visitors of St. Augustine.~~
- ~~(d) — *Penalty.* Offenses under this section shall be punishable as provided by section 1-8 of this Code.~~
- ~~(e) — *[Supplemental provisions.]* This section is not intended to replace or supersede any other ordinance or statute, but shall instead be supplemental to such ordinance or statute.~~

Section 2. Creating Chapter 18, Article I, Section 18-8. Chapter 18, Article I, Section 18-8 of the Code of the City of St. Augustine is hereby created to read as follows,

Chapter 18 - MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS AND OFFENSES

ARTICLE I. - IN GENERAL

Sec. 18-8. - Begging, panhandling and solicitation.

(a) Intent.

The purpose and intent of this article is to recognize the constitutional right of persons to solicit, including but not limited to beg and panhandle, in a peaceful and non-threatening manner; however, an increase in aggressive panhandling and begging throughout the City has become extremely disturbing and disruptive to residents and businesses, and has contributed not only to the loss of access to and enjoyment of public places but also to an enhanced sense of fear, intimidation, and disorder. Aggressive panhandling and begging usually includes approaching or following pedestrians, repetitive requests for donations of money despite refusals, the use of abusive or profane language, unwanted physical contact, and the intentional, or as incident to the aggressive panhandling and begging, blocking of pedestrian and vehicular traffic. Additionally, the

presence of panhandlers and beggars, who request money from persons in specific public areas such as outdoor cafes, automated teller machines, entrances and exits from buildings, and while standing in line to enter an event or a building, is especially troublesome because persons cannot readily escape from the undesired conduct, which often carries with it an implicit threat to both persons and property as well as incidental to the panhandling and begging activities the imperiling of the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of and visitors to St. Augustine by, among other things, blockage of ingress and egress from and into commercial businesses adjacent to public rights of way.

This article is not intended to limit any persons from exercising their constitutional right to solicit, including but not limited to beg, panhandle or solicit funds, picket, protest, or engage in any other constitutionally protected activity, when conducted in a legal manner. The goal of this article is instead to ensure the foregoing constitutional rights while through regulation acting to protect citizens from the fear and intimidation accompanying certain kinds of panhandling and begging that have become an unwelcome and overwhelming presence in the City by prohibiting aggressive panhandling and begging throughout the City and by regulating through time, place, and manner ordinance provisions regulating panhandling and begging in certain public places, based upon the foregoing significant important and substantial governmental interests set forth in the predicate clauses and an overriding compelling governmental interest to protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of St. Augustine and visitors from the adverse secondary effects of solicitation , including panhandling and begging, in public areas. The restrictions contained in this article are neither overbroad nor vague and are narrowly tailored to serve a substantial governmental interest, and preserve ample alternative areas for the valid exercise of constitutional rights of solicitation which they do as set forth more particularly herein.

Further, even if such regulations were to be deemed to trigger strict scrutiny, the blockage of ingress and egress into and from commercial businesses and other public areas as well as the impedance of pedestrian walkways and other public rights of way implicates the compelling governmental interest of St. Augustine in protecting the health, safety and welfare of its citizenry and visitors in preserving police and fire department access to such rights of way in order to save lives.

(b) Definitions.

For purposes of this article, the following words and phrases shall have the meanings ascribed to them as follows:

(1) After dark means from one half hour after sunset until one-half hour before sunrise. The times of sunset and sunrise will be established by the times listed in any local publication of general distribution.

(2) Aggressive panhandling or begging means:

a. To approach or speak to a person and demand, request or beg for money or a donation of valuable property in such a manner as would cause a reasonable person to believe that the person is being threatened with imminent bodily injury or the commission of a criminal act upon the person approached or another person in the solicited person's company, or upon property in the person's immediate possession (for example, placing oneself within 2 feet of a solicited person and/or using abusive or profane language in a loud voice while demanding or requesting money);
or

b. To maintain contact with a solicited person and continue demanding, requesting or begging for money or a donation of valuable property after the solicited person has made a negative response to an initial demand or request for money or a donation (for example, walking in front of, next to, or behind a solicited person while continuing to demand, request or beg for money from that person after that person has refused to donate or give money);

or

c. To obstruct, block or impede, either individually or as part of a group of persons, the passage or free movement of a solicited person or a person in the company of a solicited person, including persons on foot, on bicycles, in wheelchairs or operating motor vehicles or persons attempting to enter or exit motor vehicles (for example, walking, standing, sitting, laying, or placing an object in such a manner as to block passage of another person or vehicle, or to require another person or driver of a vehicle to take evasive action to avoid physical contact);

or

d. To touch or cause physical contact to a solicited person or a person in the company of a solicited person, or to touch any vehicle occupied by a solicited person or by a person in the company of the solicited person, without the person's express consent;

or

e. To engage in conduct that would reasonably be construed as intended to intimidate, compel or force a solicited person to accede to demands.

(3) Panhandle or beg means any demand or request made in person for an immediate donation of money or some other article of value from another person for the use of one's self or others, including but not limited for a charitable or sponsor purpose or that will benefit a charitable organization or sponsor. As used in this article, the word "solicit" and its forms is included in this definition. A solicitation is considered as having taken place regardless of whether the person making the solicitation received any contribution. Any purchase of an item for an amount far exceeding its value, under circumstances where a reasonable person would understand that the purchase is in substance a donation, constitutes a donation as contemplated in this definition.

(4) Prohibited areas for solicitation including but not limited to panhandling and begging means the following locations throughout the City in which it is unlawful to engage in solicitation, including but not limited to panhandling or begging, when either the panhandler or beggar or the person being panhandled is located in, on or at the following locations:

a. Within twenty (20) feet, in any direction, from any entrance or exit of commercially zoned property;

b. Within twenty (20) feet, in any direction, of any bus or trolley stop or any public transportation facility;

c. Within twenty (20) feet, in any direction, of an automated teller machine or any electronic information processing device which accepts or dispenses cash in connection with a credit, deposit or convenience account with a financial institution;

- d. Within twenty (20) feet, in any direction, of any parking lot, parking garage, parking meter or parking pay station owned or operated by the City;
- e. Within twenty (20) feet, in any direction, of any public restroom owned and operated by a governmental agency;
- f. Within one hundred (100) feet, in any direction, of any daycare or school, including pre-kindergarten through grade 12.

(c) Prohibited Conduct, Proximity and Location Restrictions.

- (1) It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in aggressive panhandling or begging on any sidewalk, highway, street, roadway, right-of-way, parking lot, park, or other public or semi-public area or in any public building lobby, entranceway, plaza or common area, public forum or limited public forum within the city limits of the City of St. Augustine.
- (2) It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in aggressive panhandling or begging on private property if the owner, tenant or lawful occupant has asked the person not to solicit on the property, or has posted a sign clearly indicating that solicitations are not welcome on the property.
- (3) It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in solicitation, including but not limited to panhandling or begging, when either the person engaged in the solicitation, including but not limited to the panhandler or beggar or the person being panhandled, is located in, on or at the following locations:
 - a. Within twenty (20) feet, in any direction, from any entrance or exit of commercially zoned property;
 - b. Within twenty (20) feet, in any direction, of any bus or trolley stop or any public transportation facility;
 - c. Within twenty (20) feet, in any direction, of an automated teller machine or any electronic information processing device which accepts or dispenses cash in connection with a credit, deposit or convenience account with a financial institution;

- d. Within twenty (20) feet, in any direction, of any parking lot, parking garage, parking meter or parking pay station owned or operated by the City;
- e. Within twenty (20) feet, in any direction, of any public restroom owned and operated by a governmental agency;
- f. Within one hundred (100) feet, in any direction, of any daycare or school, including pre-kindergarten through grade 12.

(4) It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in the following prohibit conduct:

- a. Approach an operator or other occupant of a motor vehicle for the purpose of panhandling, soliciting or begging, or offering to perform a service in connection with such vehicle, or otherwise soliciting the sale of goods or services, if such panhandling, soliciting or begging is done in an aggressive manner;
- b. Panhandle, solicit or beg at any lawfully permitted outdoor dining area or lawfully permitted outdoor merchandise area, provided such areas are in active use at the time;
- c. Panhandle, solicit or beg at any transit stop or taxi stand or in a public transit vehicle;
- d. Panhandle, solicit or beg while the person or persons being solicited is standing in line waiting to be admitted to a commercial establishment
- e. Panhandle, solicit or beg by touching the person or persons being solicited without that person's consent
- f. Panhandle, solicit or beg with the use of profane or abusive language during the solicitation or following an unsuccessful solicitation;
- g. Panhandle, solicit or beg by or with the use of any gesture or act intended to cause a reasonable person to be fearful of the solicitor or feel compelled to accede to the solicitation
- h. Panhandle, solicit or beg while under the influence of alcohol or after having illegally used any controlled substance, as defined in the Chapter 893 of the Florida Criminal Statutes; or
- i. Panhandle, solicit or beg after dark

(d) Penalty.

Any person found guilty of violating the provisions of this section shall be punished in the manner prescribed in Section 1-8 of this Code.

Section 3. Inclusion in Code. The City Commission intends that the provisions of this Ordinance shall become and shall be made part of the Code of the City of St. Augustine, that the sections of this Ordinance may be re-numbered or re-lettered and that the word ordinance may be changed to section, article or other such appropriate word or phrase in order to accomplish such intentions.

Section 4. Conflict with Other Ordinances. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 5. Severance of Invalid Provisions. In the event that any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, word, term or provision of this Ordinance shall be held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be partially or wholly invalid, unconstitutional or unenforceable or involved for any reason whatsoever, any such invalidity, unconstitutionality, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect any of the other or remaining terms, provisions, clauses, sentences, or sections of this Ordinance, and this Ordinance shall be read and/or applied as if the invalid, unconstitutional, illegal, or unenforceable section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, word, term or provision did not exist.

Section 6. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective ten (10) days after passage, pursuant to § 166.041(4), Florida Statutes.

My wife and I have just returned home from your city. We have been coming to St. Augustine since 1980 and within the last 10 years we visit 1 to 2 times per year. We usually stay at the apartment above Luli's Cupcake. You can ask Marty at First Choice Vacation Rental about how frequently we visit. We eat at the old town restaurants and spend money in old town shops. We stay 9 to 14 days each visit. We will never again visit your great city, and here is why. The homeless population has taken over old town. One morning after breakfast I went to a public restroom and a homeless man with his pants down was bathing. Approximately 30% of benches were occupied by homeless. At one point both sides of the main street in old town was blocked by homeless, we turned around and went back to the apartment. Even when we were able to navigate the streets we were harassed by homeless wanting money. One afternoon as we were leaving old town, a homeless man (talking to himself) followed my wife and I to our apartment. Twice I had to run a homeless couple off from underneath our balcony. They were smoking and cussing. They finally did leave cussing and yelling. We ended up going inside. We no longer feel safe in your city. This is the first time we did not see any police walking in old town. While sitting on the balcony one evening a homeless man urinated (right in front of me) on the building to the right side of our apartment facing street. I am retired from the military and did feel threatened while I was in your city because you had to constantly watch your back. Come on St. Augustine, you can do better. You depend on tourists and when they quit coming back like us where will you be. Most tourist and business were talking about how bad it is in St. Augustine. My wife and I come to St. Augustine to have fun and relax. This is no longer possible in your town. I along with others are spreading the word how unsafe your city has become and the homeless population problem. You have gotten the last dime from me you will ever get. There are too many other tourist cities in this great country to visit where you do not have to put up with this crap. The vacation this year was a waste of my hard earned money. Thank you for listening to me.

Besides bringing over 1,200 4th graders to St. Augustine every year, our company also brings conventioners. Dear Fellow St. Augustinian,

This letter has been on my "To-Do" list for months, but moved to the top after reading the article in the St Augustine Record on October 25, 2017 entitled *Panhandling, homelessness reaches 'crisis' levels*. As a longtime resident of the area, I was encouraged to see that this issue is being addressed—or at least evaluated. In the spirit of helping to provide information from critical stakeholders (residents and tourists) to help in the analysis of the situation and its potential consequences, I feel that it is important to communicate that the undercurrent of grumbling about this issue is increasing to a dull roar.

The negative visual aspect of the homeless—aggressive panhandling or not—on our streets is discouraging residents from going (or inviting non-resident friends and visitors to go) downtown. It is also creating an unfavorable impression on tourists, and discouraging many from becoming repeat tourists. This is a dangerous scenario for St. Augustine.

Obviously any public intoxication or aggressive behavior such as harassing or intimidating should be dealt with. But the fact that it gets to this level is a sign that there is a fundamental problem that is not being addressed. Most of the folks that have shared their thoughts about this were not victims, or even observers, of such behavior. (Except for one example of members of a wedding party who had to step over someone passed out on the sidewalk to have wedding photos taken in the Plaza.) For the most part, the impression that our town is becoming unsafe results from simply the *presence* of a growing population of folks who are very visibly mentally impaired and/or are living on the fringes of society—characteristics that evoke too many real world news reports of the background of some individual who commits a heinous act against society.

Whether actually "homeless" or not, I'm sure the city is well aware of the individuals who fall into the category of concern. There are those who are clearly sitting with all of their belongings and/or camping on benches to those with obvious mental health issues. They can be spotted anytime of any day of the week in all parts of the city. One could always take a walk through the city on a Tuesday morning as shops are opening and easily spot eight or nine of the "regulars." For the 30+ years that I have lived in this area, there has been an unacceptable presence of homeless on the streets of St. Augustine. Visitors have, for a long time, been confronted with what can only be described as an *incongruous* sight for what is supposed to be a tourist-friendly (and tourism-dependent) historic town. More recently, the absurd has risen to the obscene.

Everyone knew that St. Augustine's decision to relax the enforcement of related laws was a bad one. And the city immediately slid right down that slippery slope. Now, up and down St. George Street, folks with piles of belongings (and a pit bull) display cardboard signs with pleas for cash. Is St. Augustine a first class destination or a third world country? If one element continues to slowly creep in, the other will more swiftly depart.

I wish I had something to offer to help with the solution. I understand that there are many diverse and complicated underlying causes of homelessness. But I'm not sure that little St. Augustine has the resources (or the luxury of time) to address the issue from this perspective without suffering the negative impact on reputation (and therefore financial consequences) that will occur if not addressed immediately.

Take action now. And be prepared for media backlash. Compile the documentation including the "optics" such as images of the subject matter against the back drop of the lifeblood of St. Augustine –the historic destinations, shops, restaurants, hotels and B&Bs where dedicated folks work hard to welcome and serve customers, and where residents and visitors spend their hard-earned income. Also prepare a convincing and consistent narrative to counteract the inevitable news story of the "heartlessness" of the city.

There is no choice.

Good Afternoon Isabelle,

While conducting a site visit of downtown St. Augustine with a client yesterday at 4:45 PM, we passed several panhandlers on St. George Street. One stood out with a sign asking for money for beer. As we passed, he said loudly and directly to us "Can you give me money for beer?"

The client did not mention anything at the time, but in a follow-up meeting today he asked me what the panhandling situation was likely to be in April (a warmer month) and "if the city is safe" for his attendees. He is with a Colorado-based corporation considering bringing a group of 70-80 people to our area in April of 2019. A representative of a Chicago-based incentive travel planning company was also at the meeting.

The client is in the process of choosing between us and Palm Beach for this conference. The proposed dinner and activities in St. Augustine would represent an expenditure of approximately \$25,000, plus around \$75,000 in hotel room revenue.

Anything you and the city can do to help improve our panhandling situation and avoid risking the loss of valuable group business would be most appreciated. Please let me know if you have questions or if I can assist in any way.

Allowing people to beg and obstruct traffic hurts the livelihood of the people who live, work, pay taxes and contribute to the economy of St. Augustine.



Hi, my name is Cara. I've posted several times and had a few conversations with citizens about what is going on. I first noticed the increase in vagrants, panhandlers, homeless, whichever word you choose to use about a year ago. We live in South Georgia but visit St. Augustine at least 4 times a year. We spend a significant amount of that time in the old town. St. Augustine has been our vacation spot for over 21 years now. I was engaged and married there. If you would have told me 2 years ago that one day something would force me to choose another place for my family to visit and vacation at I would have had said that wasn't so. The old town was absolutely filthy, had a horrible smell these people laying everywhere. Benches, the gazebo, every corner nook and cranny. Try explaining 2 of these vagrants fighting with each other and one fighting with themselves to a 6 and 7 year old. I have never felt like I needed to worry about my safety or my family's while visiting until this past year. I explained on a fb post how my husband proposed on the gazebo and we take an anniversary picture every year but we were unable to due to it being trashed by the vagrants. Food bags, dirty

socks and underwear, urine soaked card board boxes. Just absolute filth. St. Augustine is a tourist hotspot and these people are flocking to that because of the potential for profit. The numbers the city has gathered have proven that. I've seen a decrease in police presence over the last year compared to years passed. At the very least these people need to have warrant Checks by law enforcement. No one knows if they are sex offenders, felons, or have active warrants. There is a good chance a handful of them are and do.

The price for parking has increased, there is an entrance fee for everything, St. Augustine is an expensive city to visit especially as often as we like to. Now with this problem, is it even worth it? We can visit somewhere else and spend less money and not be surrounded by filth. The problem with that is that nowhere else would be the city I love. As much as I love St. Augustine, I'm starting to question if it's worth the hassle. I'm sure there are many others like me. I felt like we were intruding into someone's bedroom.

I recently walked through St. Augustine with friends who were interested in moving to the area. Can you guess their first impression; it was not favorable. They did not want to keep company with beggars and vagrants. The city's vagrancy issue has chased away two potential residents. When your city's primary income is the tourism industry, how many more visitors and new residents can you afford to lose?

We recently visited New Orleans where the sidewalks, shop fronts, and streets had to be cleaned every morning because their street people had urinated and defecated wherever they

I am writing this email to you with the intent to share with you have I observed this month while I was downtown. I have been a St Augustine resident for 4 years, before that I lived in Gainesville and I grew up in Minneapolis, MN. Before relocating to St Augustine I would visit whenever I had a chance, I fell in love with our city. My husband and I were married here in 2012 and moved here shortly after. We have 2 young children and we are thrilled to say that they are in a TOP rated school district! We always say that we live where others vacation. And, because of that our children get to experience some of the coolest attractions as field trips. I can honestly say that if I was unable to chaperone the field trip that was on Monday 12/4/17 to the Oldest School House and to ride Holly Jolly Trolley I would not have allowed my daughter to attend due to the ever rising population of the displaced, homeless, panhandling whatever you might call the people who are using our streets as living rooms or their office. I'm not sure what the solution is and I understand there is a lot of hard work going on to resolve the issue. However, I wanted to share with you what I witnessed on Monday while I was on the field trip with my daughters class... we met at the swing park, walked to the Oldest School House and did the Holly Jolly Trolley. An experience most kids don't get to have as a field trip or in general!

When we were walking from the Visitor Center by the parking garage to St George Street there were a group of "vagrants" hanging around on the benches that we were going to be walking by. I noticed they were getting loud and sarcastic with two older couples, tourists who were lost and looking for a close trolley stop, there was obvious frustration and embarrassment from the tourists as they were trying to figure find their barrings, only to be chastised by the people who they thought could guide them in the right direction. When they walked away I asked if I could help them find their way.. I showed them where to find the closest stop for them to get on board a Red Train. They thanked me and we went on our way. I felt bad and embarrassed that this was the representation that they received when visiting our town.

The next day my husband and I took our 3 year old for a walk, we walked from the island over the Bridge of Lions and wanted to walk along the bay front. A BEAUTIFUL view was ruined by 4 people sleeping on benches with trash and clothing and belongings everywhere...there wasn't even a bench to sit on if we wanted to. Honestly, it was disgusting!

At the beginning of November my mother, who visits every 3 months, and my sister came to visit from MN. Of course they wanted to go downtown. My sister made a comment about how there were more Homeless on our little street than there are in Downtown Minneapolis (aka murderapolis). She was appalled as she has been here before it got out of control. I was so embarrassed for where we lived and I've never felt that way. Pride is the first word that should come to mind!

I won't be able to attend the meeting on Thursday. But, I can say I have ABSOLUTELY noticed a difference in the amount of "vagrants" downtown and it's very unfortunate. I hope that St Augustine can come to some sort of conclusion so we can resolve this problem in the near future. Good Luck at the meeting!

In the mean time, can we dedicate forces to actually cleaning our city? A light pressure washing at night would go a long way to help both issues.

While I have heard that some very expensive garbage cans have been authorized, the disrespectful behavior towards public property will not change just because we have fancy cans to hold the garbage. We have to be willing to dedicate resources to caring for our city.

There is a volunteer force of citizens monitoring the vagrants. It is likely that they would be willing to volunteer to assist the clean up efforts. Have a community clean up day and get us involved in caring for our city. You may be surprised what the hearts of our town have in store.

 Member of St. Augustine City Council and Chief of Police,

I would respectfully ask you to address the problem of the homeless and vagrants in the Historic area of St. Augustine.

In the past year, I have seen a spike in the number of vagrants who have moved into the historic area and made it their day camp/night camp and their home.

I used to enjoy wandering around the park, but now I avoid it. As I walked by the public market yesterday, it smelled like urine - and that is the straw that has broken the camel's back. Now, I am ready to take action.

In the past year of living here, I have seen:

- The Public Market and park become a regular camping area for vagrants. They are lying around all over, sleeping, littering, smoking, and drinking alcohol in the park. They bring bikes and park them all over, and they have dogs and cats, as well. The market area is filthy.
- Tourists give their leftovers to the homeless, and oftentimes the remains are left out or scattered about. This weekend, it looked like there was a food fight with slices of pizza in the grass.
- A vagrant jumped the rails at the Fort one night and went into the fortified area before the drawbridge, leaving just a few minutes later. My assumption is he was using the bathroom. I spoke with a police officer about the vagrants and he told me that they urinate and defecate in the outdoor public areas.
- Vagrants are sleeping in the pavilion on a regular basis and leaving a filthy mess once they leave. The electrical outlets have been broken or vandalized and I have seen them throwing their sleeping bags over the flower beds that are there.
- Vagrants hanging out at the Library in the early morning and at night when the Library is closed.
- A vagrant who had spread her blanket across the walkway on the bayfront, leaving pedestrians and tourists with only a foot or so to walk around.
- Vagrants sleeping at night on the porches of homes in the Aviles Street area.
- Vagrants lying in the water fountains up by the Publix on Vilano.

Since Mayor Nancy Shaver announced on the News a few months ago that City Council was being lenient on panhandling and begging, the vagrants have moved in and are now lying around on St. George Street. There were at least six vagrants with a dog along that street last night. In the spring, I was approached by an intoxicated vagrant who was camping out with a group on the dock area just north of the Bridge of Lions. I did not see them there until I walked out onto the dock. It appears that

anywhere the vagrants gather, they leave filth behind. I am just one man and I have seen more than this in the year that I have been here. How about the thousands of tourists that we have coming to the town weekly? Are tourists having to avoid the pavilion in the park or the historic public market because it is overrun by vagrants? Are they being approached by beggars as they are trying to enjoy the city with their families? Is this what we want for the Historic City of St. Augustine?

I would like the Council to consider what is currently happening with regard to the homeless population in Historic St. Augustine. It is my request that you reverse your decision to be lenient on panhandling. I request that you enforce any state laws that are being broken and establish city ordinances that forbid sleeping in the park and historic places. In addition, I would like to see a regular patrol to enforce the laws and ordinances.

I would like a response to these requests from each member so that I know where you stand on this issue. An email would be fine but if you would like to call, I am available after 4:00 daily, 321.698.2198

I wanted to give some feedback about our experience on St. George St. on Sunday 9/17/17. We visited from Jacksonville for the Sing Out Loud Festival and were incredibly surprised by the amount of panhandling between Orange St. and Treasury St. We saw at least ten people - one every 50 to 100 feet or so - and some were even in small groups. We have been to many cities with panhandlers and have never been bothered by it, but the sheer volume in such a short distance is what made it so uncomfortable on St. George St. We couldn't really enjoy walking around because we were constantly faced with signs and people asking us for money. We wanted to spend more time shopping and exploring the street but did not because of the panhandling. We are unlikely to return because of it. I would suggest that the city ban panhandling in this area, given the amount of people, businesses, and attractions that occupy such a small space. We are very easy going people who are hard to put so if this put us off, there are probably a lot more people that would not return to St. George St. because of it. I hope you find this feedback useful and will consider taking action to help visitors to St. George St. feel more at ease while enjoying what the area has to offer.

My wife and I have just returned home from your city.

We have been coming to St. Augustine since 1980 and within the last 10 years, we visit 1 to 2 times per year. We usually stay at the apartment above Luli's Cupcake.

We eat at the old town restaurants and spend money in old town shops. We stay 9 to 14 days each visit. We will never again visit your great city, and here is why.

The homeless population has taken over old town. One morning after breakfast I went to a public restroom and a homeless man with his pants down was bathing. Approximately 30% of benches were occupied by homeless. At one point both sides of the main street in old town was blocked by homeless, we turned around and went back to the apartment. Even when we were able to navigate the streets we were harassed by homeless wanting money.

One afternoon as we were leaving old town, a homeless man (talking to himself) followed my wife and I to our apartment. Twice I had to run a homeless couple off from underneath our balcony. They were smoking and cussing. They finally did leave cussing and yelling. We ended up going inside.

We no longer feel safe in your city. This is the first time we did not see any police walking in old town. While sitting on the balcony one evening a homeless man urinated (right in front of me) on the building to the right side of our apartment facing street. I am retired from the military and did feel threatened while I was in your city because you had to constantly watch your back.

Come on St. Augustine, you can do better.

You depend on tourists and when they quit coming back, like us, where will you be? Most tourists and businesses were talking about how bad it is in St. Augustine. My wife and I come to St. Augustine to have fun and relax. This is no longer possible in your town. I along with others are spreading the word how unsafe your city has become and the homeless population problem.

You have gotten the last dime from me you will ever get. There are too many other tourist cities in this great country to visit where you do not have to put up with this crap. The vacation this year was a waste of my hard-earned money.

I was added to the "Transient Problem" FB page which is where I saw & downloaded the outline of the meeting/issues.

A couple of questions:

The information puts all people who are homeless into one category - but I believe there is more than one. There is a distinct group that are homeless due to losing their home, job, spouse or a combination of these- either by natural disaster, a family or personal tragedy, etc. These individuals want help and appreciate assistance. And then you have a group that wish to remain homeless, wish to continue living on the street, but want easy \$\$ by panhandling, jumping into fountains and/or breaking into gardens and digging in the wells for cash. I believe these are 2 different types and there is a difference in personalities/character/goals/morals.

It would be interesting to compare the number complaints received by the police concerning vandalism, break-ins, panhandling & trespassing from

Nov 1, 2015-Oct 31, 2016

to those received

Nov 1, 2016 - Oct 31, 2017.

The OSH was, in my opinion, broken into 3 times. After the 1st time- the officer said that even though the person (we had on tape) approached a closed business with doors locked, it is not considered a B&E because there was NO ROOF!

Also, St. Augustine law says no riding of bicycles on St. George St. Why not add NO PARKING of bicycles on the pedestrian street. There are places to lock their bicycles in the plaza and the VIC.

As a business owner on St. George street, I have been following the news regarding panhandling in the city. As we all know, the problem has multiplied. It has become a serious problem for the business owners, tourists and citizens of St. Augustine. I am aware of the court ruling in Tampa, however, I find it hard to believe that you are so neutered by that ruling that other laws can not be enforced such as camping in public, loitering, and open container. I am not allowed to put out a sandwich board or impede traffic of any kind in front of my store and would be readily cited should I try. The city even directs how my signage can be placed and what it looks like. How can you enforce these ordinances and not the others? I called a police officer today regarding 3 people that were camped out between my shop and mi casa, their legs stretching into the street. The police officer said that he was directed to do NOTHING about it. He could do NOTHING as directed by the city attorney. This is killing our business and ruining our town. I understand the need for compassion, but these people are taking advantage of your inaction and brazenly flaunting it. I have attached 3 photos from 2:30 today of people sprawled out on St. George Street panhandling. All three photos were taken from the short distance between Mi Casa and the Oldest School house. I can imagine it is more of the same towards the Plaza.

I hear multiple complaints from my customers, saying they will not be back. I am scared for my business and for my safety, especially in the evening after several bottles have been consumed and the rowdiness begins. Last night my husband and I walked down St. George street around 9pm and did not see a single police officer.

A simple deterrent would be having more officers on patrol. They could be armed with information about St. Francis House and other facilities. Any interaction with police, even if it is just a conversation is a deterrent. You say you have no money to pay for that, but when people stop coming and residents start leaving, you will have even less.

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



I have two children that work downtown and am appalled by what is happening. They have unlicensed animals, block streets and entrances to the plaza, well, you all know it too well. I have tried to help some of them and some of them spit at me now. They are actively looking to "get" members of this Facebook group. (William Dingeman who was arrested yesterday told me about this. I drove him out to get his ID about a month ago, then stopped by PeopleReady on the way back where Republic Services took him on immediately. I used to drive for them and Advanced Disposal and we helped people like him get back on their feet. He did well the first day and then developed an attitude. He and I also spoke with Officer Shipp and he told him about the crack dealing downtown and offered to help take the main dealer down. William told us who was on Crack, how they get it, and where they smoke it, in the bathroom behind the Florida Cracker Cafe'. I have seen them back there many, many times. The girl on St. George and Hypolita and her boyfriend disappear back there often leaving whatever animal they are using that day alone on St. George.) I quit my job to share the gospel downtown and help visitors and shop owners. I am in the process of starting a pedicab business. My wife is an RN

who supervises a nursing home in Ormond Beach. Our daughter Sarah works at the Kilwin's on Treasury and our son Andrew works at Maple Street. I think we have a great city. I regularly thank the workers and police downtown for the great job they do. I know a lot more than I post online and I will share that with you and the police. We lived in downtown Minneapolis for 7 years working with inner-city kids and helping whoever we could. I worked for Billy Garaham then. I've also volunteered in jails, proson, missions and halfway houses so I'm pretty savvy to what's going on. These vagrants are well-organized and get worse by the day.

Dear Ladies,

I write this email with a heavy heart. I have been visiting St. Augustine for 20 years. It has always been the favorite city of my family-especially over the holidays. I've been on the Ghost and Gravestones tour so many times, I can recite every story. I've stayed everywhere from the Hilton to the Scottish Inn, love the cemetery's, Ripley's, the Lightner Museum and your mini golf. Last weekend I stayed at the Days Inn, had the pork chop for dinner at Aviles (so good) and breakfast at Maple Street Biscuit (also so good).

It was December five years ago when we saw our first homeless man. It was a surprise and our immediate reaction was to buy him some food so we ordered a pizza from Borrillo's and gave it to him. December four years ago was the first time we were asked for money by a man standing in front of the visitors center. That was when we noticed a few homeless people gathered on the steps there. It made us uncomfortable and sad. Last December there were many more homeless asking for money-enough so that we went back to our hotel room to drop off our purses and didn't carry them the rest of our trip. However, they had not taken over the plaza and St. George St. yet.

I can't believe what I saw on this last trip. I wish I hadn't visited. It is not the St. Augustine it used to be and I wish my last memories of it were as it was years ago. The homelessness is a huge turn off. We went to get hot chocolate at Kilwin's Friday night. There was no bench for us on St. George St. to sit on while we sipped-the benches were taken up by homeless people with animals and signs asking for money. A man with cats on leashes was plunked on the sidewalk in front of Prohibition Kitchen. His sign read "Spaceship broken. Need parts". The homelessness is bad for business and tourism. I asked several store employees about it and every one of them seemed at their wit's end. My daughter and I were up and out early Saturday morning. The cat man was at his spot. This time his sign said something like his jet was out of fuel. He was smoking a cigarette. Cigarettes are expensive. He had another homeless man visiting him and a few steps further was another homeless man. His sign read, "Visually impaired". It was all ridiculous. There was a man playing Christmas songs on his accordion. He was a welcome sight and we dropped him some money. I'm all for street performers.

On Saturday morning around 11:00 my daughter and I walked through the plaza just in time to see a homeless man pull out his penis and urinate on the monument. He must have been holding it for a long time because the puddle he left was enormous. He, and I am not lying about this, was laughing! There were people everywhere, young and old, children and grandparents and this man stood disgustingly and disrespectfully peeing on the monument as he held onto the chain laughing. The woman he was with thought it was funny too. They were scary.

How happy I am my daughter decided not to go to Flagler College. After what I witnessed this weekend, I would have made her transfer. I went to work Monday and told my coworker about the homeless problem in St. Augustine. He said his neighbor was also there last weekend and came home complaining about the homeless in the plaza as he took his family to see the tree. My old neighbor took a recent fishing trip to St. Augustine and posted on her facebook page-"What's with all the homeless in St. Augustine now? It wasn't like that before."

I'm not sure what your solution is, but the little signs saying people can't sleep here from 10:00PM to 6:00AM do nothing. I hope city officials decide to impose fines or do something to discourage the homeless. I can't imagine them taking over the downtown of the town I live in. You need to have some kind of restrictions and not be afraid to enforce them.

Regretfully, after seeing a penis and getting asked for money multiple times, we left very disheartened and have decided not to go back to our once loved city. Next holiday season we're trying Key West.

On 9/26/17 at approximately 2240 hours while conducting a routine patrol of Vickers Park I noticed multiple subjects sleeping on tables in the pavilion near the basketball courts. I made contact with the subjects and identified them to be Robert Hargrove, Vincent Kinslow, and Rose Hulsey. I first made contact with V. Kinslow and R. Hulsey whom I woke up and advised the park was closed from dusk to dawn, and advised them to pack their belongings and leave, which they immediately began doing. I then made contact with R. Hargrove and advised him of the same. R. Hargrove was slow to get up and verbally argumentative with me. He also failed to follow my order to pack his belongings.

While waiting for the subjects to gather their belongings I noticed R. Hargrove standing at the edge of the pavilion. Upon shining a light on R. Hargrove it was revealed he was urinating. V. Kinslow and R. Hulsey were still present and attempting to leave the area. When ordered to stop and cover himself R. Hargrove again became verbally combative. Once R. Hargrove had stopped urinating and covered himself I placed him in handcuffs. Upon placing R. Hargrove in handcuffs he attempted to pull away from me and became further verbally combative.

It should be noted that all three subjects had previously been advised that the park rules state that the park is closed from dusk to dawn, and had been advised that it was plainly posted on a sign approximately 50 feet from the pavilion. I had previously advised R. Hargrove multiple times that staying on the premises while the park was closed constituted trespassing. The other subjects having immediately complied with my instructions to leave were again verbally warned and released. R. Hargrove's verbal resistance as well his defiance to leave when ordered resulted in trespassing.

R. Hargrove also had a cold unopened can of beer next to him and had the odor of an alcoholic beverage on his breath.

On 11-13-17 at approximately 1657 hours, while on routine uniform bicycle patrol, I arrived in the area of Gibbs Park (at the south western foot of the Bridge of Lions), I observed all the listed subjects occupying the park. Subjects are professionally known to me as I have contact with them almost daily (just about every tour of duty). Let it be noted, with the exception of subject, William Scherwitz. He is not typically hanging around downtown and I have not had any recent prior contact with him. He identified himself to me via his FL ID card. I ran his information via dispatch and discovered that he is currently on probation for dealing in stolen property and is listed as a suspected gang member. The other subjects are known to drink alcoholic beverages regularly. And this usually occurs in the same area, in a public park, on city property. They have been cited and/or charged multiple times when found in violation by SAPD officers. This has become a near daily duty for officers assigned to patrol the area.

This report is generated to document my observations of these subjects. I observed them to occupy the park with a lot of miscellaneous personal belongings in tow. These belongings are scattered about and are frequently left behind after the subjects leave, littering the park. I know this from multiple prior contacts with these subjects in particular as this has occurred many times over. The property left behind is typically soaked with urine, feces, and/or other bodily fluids. This highlights a concern for the health and safety of visitors to the park, as well as concern for the health and safety of the city employees who are left with the task of cleaning up. The park has gained a horrible stench of urine as a result of these subject's occupation of the park for the extended period of time, as they do.

It should also be noted, that these subjects are the frequent subjects of rescue calls to the area. They are typically found passed out due to intoxication.

I took photograph of the subjects in the park when I arrived on scene. Photo will be attached to this report.

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On 01/09/2018 at 2010 hrs while on routine patrol I observed Michael Kimball, Sandra Simpson and William Muse all sitting together by the ATM machine at Bank of America, located at 60 Cathedral Pl. All three are professionally known to me and I made contact with them due to the bank being closed. None of them were using the ATM. I also know Kimball is on felony battery probation and one of his conditions is not to have contact with the victim, Sandra Simpson. When I walked up I observed Kimball leaned over and talking to Simpson. There was a 750ML bottle of C liquor sitting behind Simpson and both her and Kimball appeared intoxicated. nor is allowed to have alcohol.

At that time he was placed under arrest for violation of probation.

Ofc. Lui and Ofc. Ayers were on scene and both walked Kimball to Ofc. Lui's patrol vehicle. Once at the vehicle Ofc. Lui advised he opened the back door for Kimball and told him to get. Kimball asked if he was going to jail and Ofc. Lui stated yes. At that time he pulled away from Ofc. Lui, breaking free from his grip and began to walk away. Both Ofc. Lui and Ofc. Ayers grabbed him by the arms and brought him back to the vehicle. He continued to pull away and when they placed him against the vehicle to search him he began to push away from it using his body weight. They had to pin him against the vehicle to complete the search. When they were done they again told him to get in the vehicle. He refused to get in and again braced against the vehicle. At that time they had to forcefully put him in the vehicle. In doing so Kimball hit his head on the vehicle, causing it to bleed. Once in the backseat he again refused to put his feet in. Ofc. Ayers had to push him further into the vehicle and then close the door quickly. Kimball then began to kick the door.

Once in the vehicle Ofc. Lui transported him the St. Johns County Jail.
