## DEFENDANT SUPERVISOR OF ELECTION'S RESPONSE TO PLAINTIFF'S MOTION FOR TEMPORARY INJUNCTION AND REQUEST FOR EXPEDITED HEARING

Defendant, Kaiti Lenhart, in her official capacity as Supervisor of Elections of Flagler County ("SOE"), by and through her undersigned counsel, hereby files her Response to Plaintiff's Motion for Temporary Injunction and Request for Expedited Hearing, and states:

The SOE must maintain impartiality in election matters and therefore takes no position on the Plaintiff's request for a preliminary injunction or the underlying merits of the cause of action. However, the SOE wishes to amplify the need for a speedy resolution of this matter.

The Flagler County Canvassing Board will begin canvassing vote by mail ballots ("VBM's) on October 16, 2024, after its original meeting for that purpose was delayed due to Hurricane Milton. Additional meetings for canvassing VBM's are scheduled for October 21<sup>st</sup>, 25<sup>th</sup>, 30<sup>th</sup>, and on Election Day, November 5, 2024. In addition, early voting runs from October 21<sup>st</sup> through November 2<sup>nd</sup>. If the Charter Amendment is to be removed, the sooner such removal is ordered, the more time the SOE will have to prepare notices and train poll workers.

A speedy resolution of this matter will also help avoid potential confusion by the voting

public. For example, if the Charter Amendment is ordered removed from the ballot after 7 p.m.

on Election Day, the unofficial results of the Charter Amendment referendum will have already

been made public. In this situation, voters who are not closely following this lawsuit may not

understand the reason their votes were not ultimately counted.

The SOE notes for the Court's edification that the absolute deadline by which the Charter

Amendment could be removed from the ballot by this Court is when the Canvassing Board certifies

the results of the election on November 15, 2024, assuming no recount is ordered. After the results

are certified, the only way to challenge the referendum under Florida law, absent a constitutional

or federal claim, is pursuant to a contest of election under Section 102.168, Florida Statutes.

Although the certification of the election provides a clear deadline, the SOE urges the Court to

decide this matter as soon as practicable within the Court's resources. If ordered to remove the

referendum from the ballot prior to certification of the election, the SOE can program ballot

tabulators to exclude the referendum from the vote tabulation.

In sum, the interests of the SOE in conducting an orderly election, the interests of the

Canvassing Board in certifying the results, and the interests of the public in understanding the

outcome of the referendum will all be served by granting the Plaintiff's request for an expedited

hearing.
