



Florida's January Employment Figures Released

NOTE TO EDITORS: Every March, the U.S. Department of Labor's Bureau of Labor Statistics and the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity release January employment and unemployment estimates as well as revised historical data. Today's report is the result of that annual process, which is known as "benchmarking." Benchmark revisions are a standard part of the estimation process and take place at this time every year in each state nationwide. As a result of this annual benchmarking process, the release of January and February 2018 employment data is scheduled for March 12 and March 23, respectively.

Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 3.9 percent in January 2018, unchanged from the revised December 2017 rate, but down 0.7 percentage point from a year ago. There were 397,000 jobless Floridians out of a labor force of 10,152,000. The U.S. unemployment rate was 4.1 percent in January.

Florida's seasonally adjusted total nonagricultural employment was 8,670,500 in January 2018, an increase of 10,500 jobs (+0.1 percent) over the month. The state gained 150,900 jobs over the year, an increase of 1.8 percent. Nationally, the number of jobs rose 1.5 percent over the year. Prior to September 2017, Florida's over-the-year job growth rate had exceeded or equaled the nation's rate since May 2012.

Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)

- The number of jobs in Florida was 8,670,500 in January 2018, up 150,900 jobs compared to a year ago. The industry gaining the most jobs was professional and business services (+36,000 jobs, +2.7 percent).
- Other industries gaining jobs over the year included leisure and hospitality (+32,400 jobs, +2.7 percent); construction (+28,600 jobs, +5.8 percent); education and health services (+17,100 jobs, +1.4 percent); financial activities (+15,000 jobs, +2.7 percent); trade, transportation, and utilities (+11,700 jobs, +0.7 percent); government (+6,500 jobs, +0.6 percent); and manufacturing (+5,400 jobs, +1.5 percent).
- The two industries losing jobs were other services (-1,000 jobs, -0.3 percent); and information (-700 jobs, -0.5 percent).

Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In January 2018, St. Johns County had the state's lowest unemployment rate (3.3 percent); followed by Okaloosa County (3.5 percent); and Orange, Seminole, and Wakulla counties (3.6 percent each).
- Citrus County had the highest unemployment rate (6.0 percent) in Florida in January 2018, followed by Sumter County (5.9 percent); and Hendry and Highlands counties (5.6 percent each).

Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In January 2018, 21 out of 24 metro areas in Florida had over-the-year job gains. The areas with the largest gains were Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford (+41,300 jobs, +3.4 percent), Tampa-St. Petersburg-Clearwater (+26,400 jobs, +2.0 percent), and Jacksonville (+19,700 jobs, +2.9 percent).
- The three metro areas losing jobs over the year were Naples-Immokalee-Marco Island (-5,200 jobs, -3.5 percent); Sebring (-900 jobs, -3.4 percent); and Cape Coral-Ft. Myers (-100 jobs, less than -0.1 percent).

The unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Reemployment Assistance tax records and other data.
