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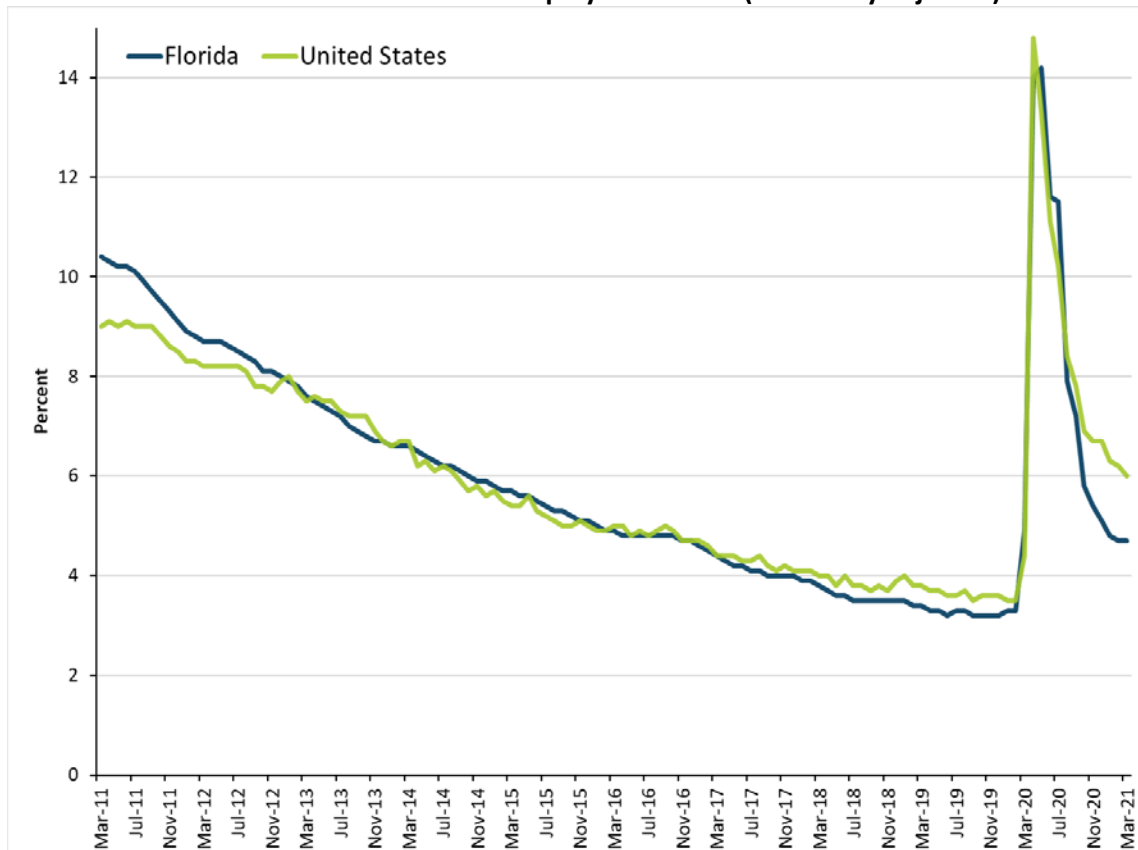
Florida's March Employment Figures Released

Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.7 percent in March 2021, unchanged from the February 2021 rate, and down 0.2 percentage point from a year ago. There were 475,000 jobless Floridians out of a labor force of 10,170,000. The U.S. unemployment rate was 6.0 percent in March.

Florida's seasonally adjusted total nonagricultural employment was 8,553,600 in March 2021, an increase of 32,200 jobs (+0.4 percent) over the month. The state lost 445,800 jobs over the year, a decrease of 5.0 percent. Nationally, the number of jobs fell 4.5 percent over the year.

March labor statistics reflect the continued effects of COVID-19 and the efforts to reopen businesses and services.

Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)

- Florida lost 1,269,200 jobs from February to April 2020 and has since gained back over half of the jobs lost (+750,700 jobs).
- The number of jobs in Florida was 8,553,600 in March 2021, down 445,800 jobs compared to a year ago. All ten major industries experienced negative over-the-year job growth in March.
- The industry losing the most jobs over the year was leisure and hospitality (-236,000 jobs, -19.0 percent).

Other industries losing jobs over the year included total government (-50,100, -4.4 percent); trade, transportation, and utilities (-49,100 jobs, -2.7 percent); education and health services (-45,100 jobs, -3.3 percent); other services (-25,200 jobs, -7.2 percent); professional and business services (-18,000 jobs, -1.3 percent); information (-8,000 jobs, -5.8 percent); manufacturing (-7,200 jobs, -1.9 percent); construction (-6,900 jobs, -1.2 percent); and financial activities (-2,300 jobs, -0.4 percent).

Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In March 2021, Monroe County had the state's lowest unemployment rate (3.3 percent), followed by St. Johns County and Wakulla County (3.6 percent each), Alachua County, Clay County, Collier County, Nassau County, Okaloosa County, Santa Rosa County and Union County (4.0 percent each).
- Miami-Dade County had the highest unemployment rate (8.2 percent) in Florida in March 2021, followed by Sumter County (6.6 percent), Citrus County and Osceola County (6.4 percent each).

Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In March 2021, 22 out of 24 metro areas in Florida had over-the-year job losses. The areas with the largest losses were Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford (-154,800 jobs, -11.6 percent), Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall (-82,500 jobs, -6.8 percent), and Fort Lauderdale-Pompano Beach-Deerfield Beach (-46,800 jobs, -5.4 percent).
- The Lakeland-Winter Haven MSA (4,300 jobs, +1.8 percent) was the only metro area to experience job growth over the year in March 2021. Homosassa Springs MSA was unchanged over the year.

The unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Reemployment Assistance tax records and other data.
