

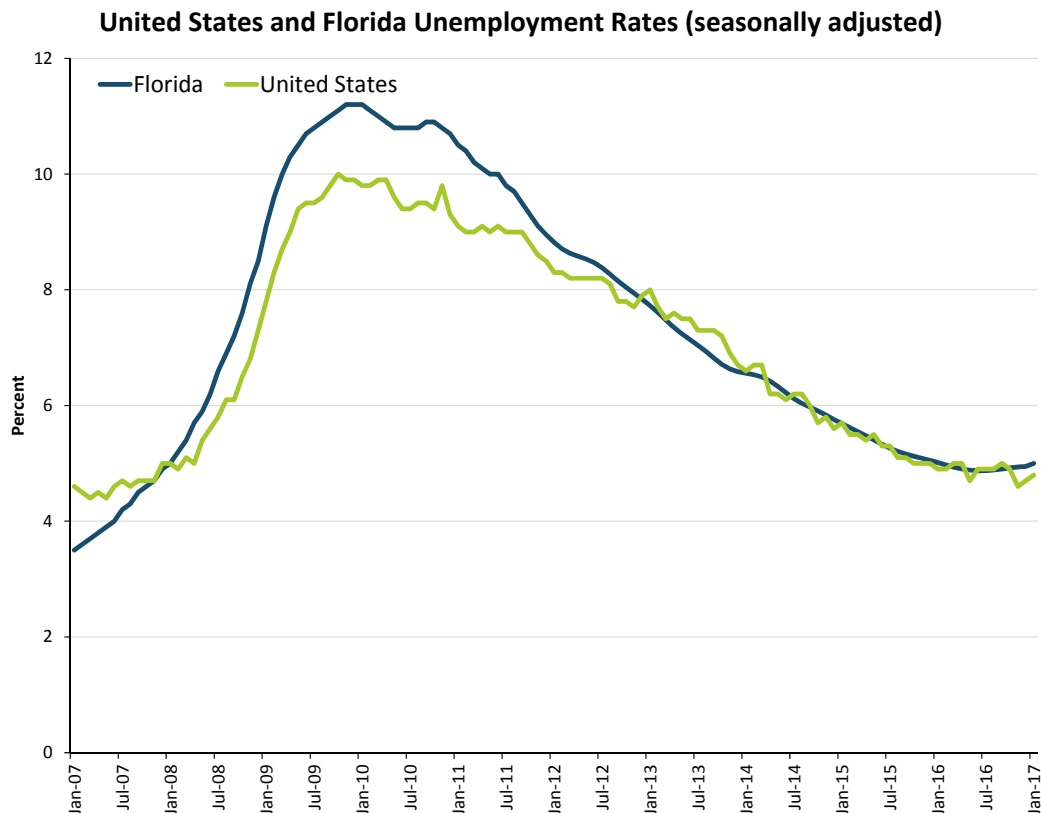
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Florida's January Employment Figures Released

NOTE TO EDITORS: Every March, the U.S. Department of Labor's Bureau of Labor Statistics and the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity release January employment and unemployment estimates as well as revised historical data. Today's report is the result of that annual process, which is known as "benchmarking." Benchmark revisions are a standard part of the estimation process and take place at this time every year in each state nationwide. As a result of this annual benchmarking process, the release of January and February 2017 employment data is scheduled for March 13 and March 24, respectively.

Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 5.0 percent in January 2017, up 0.1 percentage point from the December 2016 rate, but unchanged from a year ago. There were 503,000 jobless Floridians out of a labor force of 9,995,000. The U.S. unemployment rate was 4.8 percent in January.

Florida's seasonally adjusted total nonagricultural employment was 8,546,700 in January 2017, an increase of 54,300 jobs (+0.6 percent) over the month. The state gained 277,900 jobs over the year, an increase of 3.4 percent. Nationally, the number of jobs rose 1.6 percent over the year. Florida's over-the-year job growth rate has exceeded the nation's rate since May 2012.

Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)

- The number of jobs in Florida was 8,546,700 in January 2017, up 277,900 jobs compared to a year ago. January 2017 was the 78th consecutive month with positive over-the-year job growth. The industry gaining the most jobs was professional and business services (+55,900 jobs, +4.4 percent).
- Other industries gaining jobs included education and health services (+44,300 jobs, +3.6 percent); trade, transportation, and utilities (+42,900 jobs, +2.5 percent); leisure and hospitality (+37,800 jobs, +3.3 percent); construction (+36,400 jobs, +7.9 percent); other services (+18,200 jobs, +5.3 percent); government (+17,300 jobs, +1.6 percent); financial activities (+14,100 jobs, +2.6 percent); and manufacturing (+11,200 jobs, +3.2 percent).
- The information industry lost 100 jobs (-0.1 percent) over the year.

Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In January 2017, Monroe County had the state's lowest unemployment rate (3.5 percent), followed by St. Johns County (4.3 percent), and Wakulla County (4.5 percent).
- Hendry County had the highest unemployment rate (8.1 percent) in Florida in January 2017, followed by Sumter County (7.6 percent), and Citrus County (7.5 percent).

Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In January 2017, 23 out of 24 metro areas in Florida had over-the-year job gains. The areas with the largest gains were Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford (+54,600 jobs, +4.6 percent), Tampa-St. Petersburg-Clearwater (+38,200 jobs, +3.0 percent), and Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall (+31,800 jobs, +2.8 percent).
- The Homosassa Springs metro area was unchanged over the year and was the only metro area in Florida without job gains.

Note: The unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Reemployment Assistance tax records and other data.
