

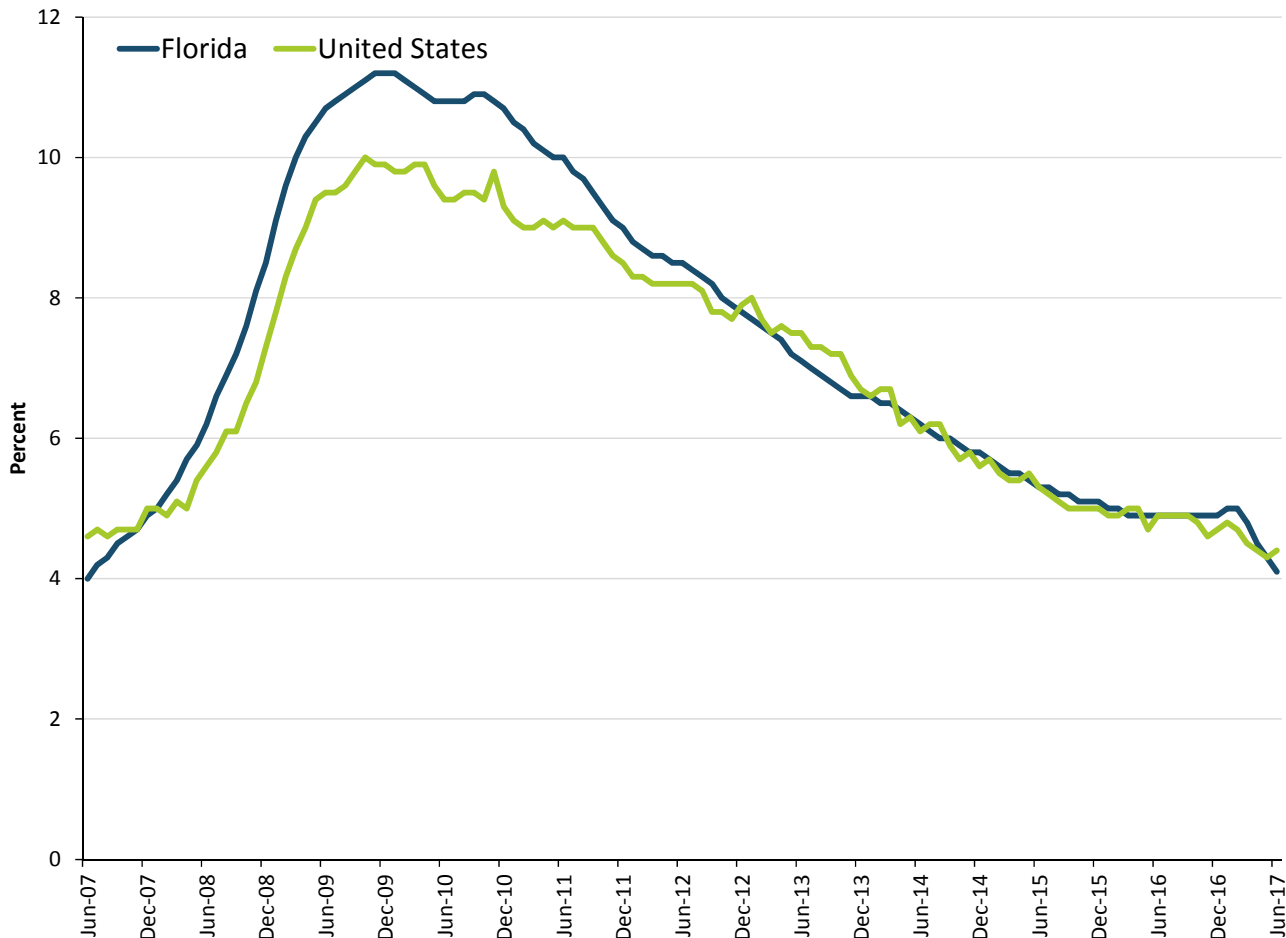
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Florida's June Employment Figures Released

Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.1 percent in June 2017, down 0.2 percentage point from 4.3 percent in May 2017, and down 0.8 percentage point from a year ago. There were 419,000 jobless Floridians out of a labor force of 10,138,000. The U.S. unemployment rate was 4.4 percent in June.

Florida's seasonally adjusted total nonagricultural employment was 8,602,700 in June 2017, an increase of 19,400 jobs (+0.2 percent) over the month. The state gained 238,600 jobs over the year, an increase of 2.9 percent. Nationally, the number of jobs rose 1.6 percent over the year. Florida's over-the-year job growth rate has exceeded the nation's rate since May 2012.

Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)

- The number of jobs in Florida was 8,602,700 in June 2017, up 238,600 jobs compared to a year ago. June 2017 was the 83rd consecutive month with positive over-the-year job growth. The industry gaining the most jobs was professional and business services (+47,800 jobs, +3.7 percent).
- Other industries gaining jobs included education and health services (+40,300 jobs, +3.3 percent); trade, transportation, and utilities (+35,600 jobs, +2.1 percent); leisure and hospitality (+33,500 jobs, +2.9 percent); construction (+32,400 jobs, +6.9 percent); other services (+17,400 jobs, +5.0 percent); manufacturing (+10,900 jobs, +3.1 percent); financial activities (+10,800 jobs, +2.0 percent); and government (+10,800 jobs, +1.0 percent).
- The information industry lost 700 jobs (-0.5 percent) over the year.

Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In June 2017, Monroe County had the state's lowest unemployment rate (2.8 percent); followed by St. Johns County (3.3 percent); and Okaloosa County (3.4 percent).
- Hendry County had the highest unemployment rate (9.4 percent) in Florida in June 2017, followed by Hardee County (6.7 percent); and Citrus County (6.0 percent).

Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In June 2017, all 24 metro areas in Florida had over-the-year job gains. The areas with the largest gains were Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford (+47,200 jobs, +4.0 percent); Tampa-St. Petersburg-Clearwater (+46,300 jobs, +3.6 percent); and Ft. Lauderdale-Pompano Beach-Deerfield Beach (+35,100 jobs, +4.3 percent).

Note: The unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Reemployment Assistance tax records and other data.
