- The average water demand for the week was 8.501 million gallons per day.
- The average wastewater flow for the week was 6.309 million gallons per day.
- Crews installed 33 new water meters, 2 new reuse meters and 1 new PEP tank.
- Crews replaced 4 PEP tanks. There are 23 new PEP tanks pending and 15 PEP tank replacements pending. Currently all new tanks are being installed within 2 days of site ready.
- There are 250 new meter installations pending, with 61 cleared and an average installation time of 3 weeks.
- Wastewater crews installed 6 new PEP pumps, 12 PEP electrical assemblies and 3 risers.
- Replaced 18 PEP pumps, 33 floats, 1 back lid, 8 ball valves, 11 boxes, 2 PEP panels, 7 cleanout caps and repaired 1 service lateral.
- There were 41 calls after hours.
- Water Distribution crews repaired 3 water service lines, 8 manifolds, completed 7 meter pit adjustments/replacements and replaced 3 water service lines. Tested and repaired 272 backflow preventers.
- Wastewater crews inspected via CCTV 6,296 feet of gravity sewer, 28 manholes and 2 pump stations annual inspections.
- On May 4th, Florida Department of Environmental Protection onsite for a plant tour and inspection of Water Treatment Plant #2.
- On May 7th, staff from Water Treatment Plant #2 completed the equipment upgrade project of wellsite LW-23.
- Staff from Environmental attended Arbor Day Event disguised as a “Recycle-a-saurus” to help promote recycling for the City.

HIGHLIGHTS

Wastewater Maintenance

On Monday morning April 30th 2018, an 8" gravity sewer main collapsed, while the contractor was pulling sewer liners. A portion of Florida Park Drive had to be closed in order to facilitate the repair. A bypass pumping system was put into operation in order to keep the wastewater collection system in use for residents. Dewatering has been installed and repair will begin as soon as the dewatering is sufficient to perform the work.

Miller Pipeline completed 500' of EX liner on Florida Park Drive. Three Utility staff worked night shift to handle traffic control and to monitor pump stations.

UPDATE to Immediate road closure: Florida Park Drive

Palm Coast – The City of Palm Coast has been able to shorten the road closure and detour on Florida Park Drive to include just the segment from Flarestone Court to Forest Hill Drive.

The detour is expected to be in place for at least three days. Updates will be provided when additional information is available.

The unexpected road closure was needed after a gravity sewer line collapsed overnight Monday during a Utility project. The Utility Department is setting up a bypass pumping system and a dewatering system that will be in place while repairs are made. The City will be tank-trucking the wastewater system in that area until the bypass pumps are set up.

The City of Palm Coast appreciates the patience and cooperation of residents and motorists while this important repair is being made.

Water aerobics, teen log rolling among the fun in May at Frieda Zamba Pool

Palm Coast – It's pool time! Palm Coast Parks & Recreation has a full schedule of lessons, special events and classes at Frieda Zamba Swimming Pool, 339 Parkview Drive, Palm Coast, during the month of May – including a new weekly Water Aerobics exercise class.

Two free introductory classes for the new Water Aerobics program will be offered 9-10 a.m. Fridays, May 11 and 18. This instructor-led class will meet weekly on Friday mornings. Starting May 25, the cost will be \$40 per five-week session or \$8 weekly. Pre-registration is required, even for the free intro classes, at www.palmcoastgov.com/register.

Also new this year is a new Teen Log Rolling program! Teens can make friends and enjoy friendly competition while trying to stay atop a floating log. The program will be held on Sunday afternoons from 4:45-5:45 p.m. from May 27 to July 22. The cost is \$5/day, with pre-registration required at www.palmcoastgov.com/register.

It's almost time to start the Summer Swim Fitness Challenge to improve your overall fitness. The goal is to swim 100 miles during the summer! (Each mile is about 33 laps.) The challenge will run from May 26 through Sept. 2 during open pool hours. Prizes will be awarded to top finishers. The Summer Swim Fitness Challenge is free with paid pool admission. Be sure to sign up at the front desk.

Special Events: Mark your calendars now for two special events coming up at Frieda Zamba Pool in late May.

The pool will be open seven days a week starting Saturday, May 26. That day is the City's annual Pool Safety Day, from 1-4 p.m. With the start of the swimming season, this is a good opportunity to brush up on safety in and around the pool. Activities will include pool games and mini learn-to-swim classes, and information will be provided on water safety and basic first aid. Discounted admission is \$1 for 17 years and under and \$2 for adults and seniors. There is no need to sign up in advance.

On Memorial Day – Monday, May 28 – the pool will be paying Tribute to the Troops in honor of current and retired military personnel and Gold Star families. Show your military ID for free admission. The pool will be open 10:30 a.m.-7:30 p.m. that day.

More Classes and Lessons: Swim lessons will be offered throughout the summer, with the next session starting May 21. In addition, there are a number on ongoing and special classes. Those programs include:

- Aqua Zumba – There are two class options for Aqua Zumba -- Mondays and Wednesdays from 5:45-6:45 p.m. or Tuesdays and Thursdays from 9-10 a.m. Aqua Zumba blends the Zumba philosophy with water resistance for a more challenging fitness routine. Participants can sign up for a five-week session or pay for each class separately. The cost is \$40 per session or \$8 drop-in. Pre-registration is required at www.palmcoastgov.com/register.
- American Red Cross Lifeguard Certification Class – To become certified as a lifeguard, this class will be offered Friday-Sunday, May 25-27, with the Friday class being 4-8 p.m. and the weekend sessions from 8 a.m.-6 p.m. The purpose of the American Red Cross Lifeguarding course is to provide entry-level lifeguard participants with the knowledge and skills to prevent, recognize and respond to aquatic emergencies. Animals ready for homes

We have all had that one cat that just won't stop using everything as a scratching post. We want to safeguard our belongings but should we do it at the cost of our cat's comfort? Some veterinarians are weighing in on the subject and many are not offering the procedure any longer. Declawing is a surgical procedure that removes the cat's claws. The surgery removes all or most of the last bone on each of the toes in a cat's paw. The Flagler Humane Society offers some alternatives to declawing. Alternative solutions can begin as soon as kitten hood. Start by training kittens to use scratching posts or other appropriate places to scratch. Soft Paws (kitty fake nails) can be applied young so the kitten can get used to the feel of them. Teach kittens to control their claws during human play and offer toys instead of using hands. Call FHS for more information on alternatives to declawing.
